Week 1: Stories of Legacy in the Bible and How They Inspire Us Today Speaker: Christi Greever

1. Abraham - Legacy of Faith and Obedience

- · Story: Genesis 12:1–3 God calls Abraham to leave everything familiar.
- Faith: Romans 4:3; Galatians 3:6 Abraham's belief was counted for righteousness.
- · Impact: Abraham trusted God even when unclear, leaving a model for us. Hebrews 11:8–10.
- · Application: Faith and obedience today still shape future generations.

2. Joseph - Legacy of Forgiveness and Perseverance

- Story: Genesis 50:19–20 Joseph forgives his brothers.
- · Endurance: Through betrayal, slavery, and prison, Joseph held fast to God.
- · Impact: His response saved nations.
- · Application: Choosing forgiveness over bitterness builds a legacy of grace and trust in God's plan.

3. David - Legacy of Leadership and Repentance

- Story: 1 Samuel 16:11–13 God calls David from shepherd to king.
- Repentance: Psalm 51:10 David's prayer of contrition.
- · Impact: Though flawed, he was "a man after God's own heart" (Acts 13:22).
- · Application: True legacy is not perfection, but humility, repentance, and worship.

4. Jesus Christ - The Ultimate Legacy

- Story: John 3:16; John 15:13 His life, sacrifice, and resurrection.
- · Impact: His legacy is salvation through the new birth (Acts 2:38).
- · Application: Our lives should reflect His love, holiness, and self-sacrifice.

5. Apostles & Early Church - Legacy of Witness and Community

- · Story: Acts 2:42–47 The early church's devotion to doctrine, fellowship, prayer, and breaking of bread.
- · Impact: They turned the world upside down with the message of Jesus (Acts 17:6).
- Application: We must continue their legacy by faithfully proclaiming the Oneness message and building Spirit-filled communities.

Key Takeaways: A lasting legacy is not wealth or fame, but:

- Personal faith and obedience.
- Integrity and repentance.
- Forgiveness and perseverance.
- Love, sacrifice, and truth.
- Commitment to community and witness.
