### Why Who We Worship Matters

- Many people know how to worship but are unsure who they are worshipping
- Worship without revelation becomes routine and shallow
- True worship flows from a relationship with God (John 4:23–24)

### Foundation: We Worship the One True God

- God is not divided — He is One (Deuteronomy 6:4; Isaiah 45:4)

### God Revealed in Jesus Christ

- God has revealed Himself in Jesus; though He works in different ways, He remains One (John 1:1, 14; Colossians 2:9)

### We Worship a Personal Savior

- God is relational and approachable — we call on the One we trust
- Relationship turns religion into revelation (Hebrews 4:15; Psalm 139:1–4)

### Revelation Changes Worship

- Encounters with God bring transformation and reverence (seen in Moses, Isaiah, and Thomas)

### Worship Through Daily Living

- Worship is expressed through obedience, attitude, service, giving, and prayer
- External identity does not equal true loyalty or surrender

### We Reflect Who We Worship

- We become like what we admire
- Worship shapes character and spiritual growth (2 Corinthians 3:18)

### Common Worship Errors

- Emotion without obedience
- Noise without holiness
- Public expression without private devotion
- Music without surrender

### Living With Revelation

- Worship deepens as we grow in knowing Christ (Philippians 3:10)
